2021-2023: Director of Basketball Operations. Promoted by Mark Turgeon in April 2021. Added interim assistant-coach duties during 2021-22 after Danny Manning became interim head coach. Maryland returned to the NCAA second round in 2023.

2023-25: Assistant Coach. Elevated to a full assistant role. In 2024-25, Maryland went 27-9, finished second in the Big Ten and reached the Sweet 16. Derik Queen became Big Ten Freshman of the Year and a first-round NBA draft pick.

In the summer of 2015, Manning led a Global Sports Academy team on an eight-day, four-game tour of Croatia, where the group competed against professional teams and traveled throughout the region. The trip included Siena players Marquis Wright and Kenny Wormley and marked Manning's third international coaching tour in four years, following earlier trips through Belgium, Germany, England, France and the Netherlands.

For Manning, the experience was another opportunity to develop players outside the traditional college setting, exposing them to professional-level competition and a different basketball culture.

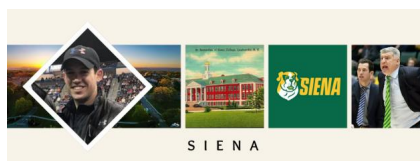
